

3-year Post Doc at the Department of Sociology

We are seeking to fill the position of a **post doc-researcher** within the *HypoFam* project (Austrian Science Fund FWF grant No. P 35136_G. Project lead: Nadia Steiber), ideally by January 2022.

The rising share of heterosexual couples in which the woman is more highly educated or earns more than the man (hypogamy) is likely to have profound consequences for demographic and economic behaviours. Based on high-quality register data on more than half a million couples, the *HypoFam* project investigates how the changing composition of couples has changed power dynamics within couples, fertility decisions, and the gender division of labour. The project is carried out by a highly interdisciplinary team at the intersection of sociology, demography, and labour market research.
